Do You Know Which Voting District You Are in Now?

There are some newly configured state and federal congressional districts in Santa Barbara County. The redistricting efforts that took place recently were triggered by the Census in 2020.


The 24th Congressional District

Most of us in Santa Barbara, Goleta, and Carpinteria are now in the same federal congressional district - District 24. But the boundaries of the district have been changed. Salud Carbajal, the incumbent in the House of Representatives, is running for reelection in November.



New State Assembly District 37

We all were in District 37 prior to the redistricting efforts and Steve Bennett was our representative. Although we will continue to be in District 37, the boundaries of the district were completely changed and Steve Bennett will no longer represent that district. See the map below showing the old (on the left) and new districts.



State Senate District 19

All of Santa Barbara County is in District 19 and will continue to be in that district going forward. The district boundaries have been changed though, as shown below. Monique Limón is now and will continue to be our representative in that Senate district (if she runs and wins in November 2024!)

They will describe the propositions, let you know who helped get them on the ballot, what the cost implications are for each one, and who supports and opposes each proposition or measure. This forum will be held on Zoom, livestreamed on the League's Facebook page (LWVSB), and recorded in both English and Spanish for later viewing via our YouTube channel.

Easy Voter Guides Are Coming Help Needed to Distribute Them

Although the League of Women Voters of California is not able to provide local Leagues with free copies of the Easy Voter Guides this year, we were able to use funds in the Voter Service budget to order 2,000 guides in English and 1,500 in Spanish.

Members of the Voter Service Team will help distribute them to local organizations, such as retirement communities, Housing Authority low-income residences, bodegas and other small grocery stores in Latinx communities, and libraries in Santa Barbara, Carpinteria, and Goleta.

I have been encouraged by the LWVSB Leadership Team to lead an effort to examine topics and expand membership of our Sustainable Communities Committee. The next meeting will be on Friday, Sept. 16 at 11am by Zoom.

Here is the committee's description from our website, <u>lwvsantabarbara.org</u>:

"The Sustainable Communities Committee studies the problems that affect sustainability on the South Coast. Join us to grapple with the climate crisis, lack of affordable housing, questions of density, open

space protection, transportation, natural resources, energy, and water issues. You can help us with oversight of city, county and district meetings and get involved in shaping local positions in line with LWV's adopted state and national positions."

I recently sent a form and survey questions to current members of "SusComm." If you have an interest in any of the topics above and did not get the email on Aug. 24, please request the form from me at grasso2230@gmail.com. I would like to get the replies back by Sept. 9 in order to collate and present them as a baseline for our discussion.

As part of this process, over the next few months we will take a look at the overlaps between the Sustainable Communities, Housing and Social Policy Committees to see whether we should merge two and/or move a few topics from one committee to another.

September Housing Committee Agenda

Drafts for the Housing Element Update (HEU) of the Cities of Goleta and Santa Barbara have been submitted to the State for comments. They can be found here:

<u>City of Goleta</u> <u>City of Santa Barbara</u> <u>County of Santa Barbara</u>

By the time this newsletter is published we should have a list of sites that would be suitable for housing developments in the unincorporated areas of South County. Unlike the cities, the County will need to upzone parcels to show that the state's recommendation for 4142 more units for the South County can be accommodated by our zoning over the next eight years.

Housing Projects we are monitoring are:

- Funk Zone mixed use development by SOMO SB, 155 units;
- Milpas Gardens, 418 Milpas, 90 units + small hotel;
- Heritage Ridge, on Camino Vista, Goleta, 332 units;
- Tatum and MTD (close to 101 and Turnpike); and
- Bailard affordable housing in Carpinteria.

The Funk Zone and Milpas Gardens projects are especially relevant for reviewing what might need to be added or changed in the HEUs before the final votes in February 2023. For example, new state laws are allowing developers to increase building sizes and add 50% more units by including just 15% very low income units in their project. The Housing Committee will look into how local policies and programs can produce a more desirable outcome for our extreme context of low vacancy rate and sky-high rents.

Consider all the above to be our agenda for the next Housing Committee meeting on Friday, Sept. 16, noon to 1pm. We will also review whether we should merge with the Sustainable Communities Committee and/or move a few topics from one committee to another including Social Policy.
