

Housing and Sustainable Communities Committees Back to Regular Dates

On Friday, Feb. 3 the LWVSB Sustainable Communities and Housing Committees return to their first Friday date with a new regular time for SusComm (10:30 to 11:45am) and noon to 1pm for Housing. Zoom links are in the **Calendar**

The Housing Committee will share status reports from our new weekly work groups who are interviewing staff from the City of Santa Barbara about the proposed La Cumbre housing project building height, planning challenges and affordable housing concerns. Other likely topics will be fundraising options through ballot measures and issues related to the County's Housing Element Update which is posted at | this link | The conflict between agricultural land preservation and affordable housing on the South County sites will be outlined along with the process for public comment.

There is no planned speaker for the SusComm meeting to allow time for reports and discussion. Committee members are asked to think about their areas of interest and suggest a report they would like to share to put on the agenda. One topic of interest is how creek issues affect housing developments. Possible resources to follow up on: City of Santa Barbara Creeks Restoration and Water Quality Improvement Division or the Santa Barbara Urban Creeks Council.



League Members Tour DignityMoves Tiny Homes

League board members Gail Osherenko and Pam Flynt Tambo. together with Maureen Earls from CLUE-SB, recently toured DignityMoves tiny homes in downtown Santa Barbara. The center opened last summer as a temporary home for people who are unsheltered. They focused first on housing people who were living on State Street and especially helped women move off the street into safe housing. Now there are plans to add 300 more tiny homes at other sites throughout the county.

From the just-released update on a County project addressing homelessness:

"On January 24th, the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors unanimously supported the updated Community Action Plan which calls for the development of approximately 437 beds, more than closing the existing shelter gap of 432 beds county-wide. Spurred by the resounding success of our 35-unit interim supportive housing community in Downtown Santa Barbara, the County is partnering with DignityMoves to accelerate progress towards that goal.

"We're calling this new initiative DignityNOW, an innovative strategy for ending unsheltered homelessnes in a community with one bold, comprehensive campaign. Building one shelter at a time is progress, but merely chips away at the problem. DignityNOW expands that progress in a rapid and scalable way."

What are the Important Issues For State League Action Plan?

About 15 LWVSB members met in mid-January to discuss the Program Planning task requested by LWVC to create the state League's Plan of Action for the next two years. The goal is to propose three "Issues for Emphasis." We acknowledged that we must continue to work toward "Making Democracy Work" and use a DEI equality lens (Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion) with all of our plans. And, we noted that LWVC has joined a national campaign—National Popular Vote—to abolish the Electoral College in our national elections. It will then up to our local Leagues to propose additional topics for action by our state League through Program Planning.

Climate Emergency

Locally we have active topical committees addressing housing issues and criminal justice reform. Our Sustainable Communities committee addresses many issues relating to climate change or climate emergency, but is not concentrating on any one particular issue. We agreed that we will suggest that LWVC change their term "Climate Change" to "Climate Emergency."

Housing

Our Housing Committee is laser focused on monitoring the plans required of local municipalities—county and cities in South SB County—to update their building plans as required by the state. This work is ongoing—beyond this year. Our Housing Committee considers both access to housing and the creation of new housing. Frequent topics for discussion include building housing and creating affordable, low

income, very low income, and workforce housing. The challenges for our communities indicate that housing is a topic that our League should continue to work on. So, it's on our list to send to the state.

Criminal Justice

LWVSB Criminal Justice Reform Task Force led by Gail Osherenko continues to work with the CLUE-SB as a WorkGroup interfacing with county officials and learning more every month about how Public Safety works in our county. This group's overall goal is to reduce recidivism for people involved with the jail and includes a focus on the required jail remodel, better services for people in our jails through the Public Defender and Probation, and better social services and behavioral wellness care for people affected by our Public Safety system. This Task Force is part of the Social Policy Committee and is continuing its work with our League.

Health Care

The topic of Health Care for All was introduced at our meeting. We recognize that this is an important issue and it is on the national League agenda, but not the state's. We have not had additional support brought to our attention thus far and have not planned to move it forward unless we hear from members by February 10.

The final decision as to the topics we will send to LWVC will be made by our local League Board of Directors on Feb. 11, our board meeting date. Members should contact a board member if there are additional issues that should be considered for inclusion in our Program Planning response to LWVC. 


